Protecting Your Car

Here are some tips to protect your car and your possessions.

- ◇ Make sure that your car is locked (including the trunk) whenever you park. If the car's windows are open, then your car is not fully locked!
- ◇ Always use or activate your car's security device.
- ◇ Do not leave valuables such as cell phones, wallets, computer laptops, luggage, GPS devices, cameras or other priceless possessions in plain sight. In addition, place packages in the trunk or out of view.
- ◇ Keep a second set of car keys either in your wallet or purse or in another secure place.
- ◇ Know your license plate number.
- ◇ If self-parking your car, make sure that you know where you have parked.

Hotel and Motel Security

Las Vegas hotels and motels take your security seriously. As your lodging host, our casinos, hotels, and motels want you to have a safe and secure Las Vegas vacation. Please help them keep you safe by observing the following tips:

- ◇ Read the instructions upon entering your room regarding personal safety and security.
- ◇ Know where the closest fire exit is located.
- ◇ Know what to do in case of a blackout or electrical failure; if in doubt, call the front desk.
- ◇ Never allow any uninvited person into your room.
- ◇ Whenever you are in your room, always lock your door and use the deadbolt and/or chain for extra protection.
- ◇ Make sure your door is locked upon exiting the room.
- ◇ Place valuables in the hotel safety deposit box.
- ◇ Unpack your belongings and place them in a closet or drawer.
- ◇ Do not enter into an elevator with someone who makes you feel uncomfortable.
- ◇ If you have a reason to question your security due to a suspicious person, return to the main floor and report that person.
- ◇ If someone makes you feel uncomfortable report that person to hotel security or the front desk.

Nightclub Safety

- ◇ Know your surroundings and the nightclub's street address; ask for a business card.
- ◇ Know where all emergency exits are located.
- ◇ Make sure you designate a friend as the driver for the night on the town.
- ◇ Always observe drinks being prepared; keep your drink with you at all times.
- ◇ Only leave the bar with someone you know.

General Safety Tips

- ◇ Take your common sense with you.
- ◇ Prostitution is illegal in Clark County.
- ◇ Street gambling is illegal everywhere.
- ◇ Travel only in legal public vehicles.
- ◇ Keep your hotel's business card on your person but not in your wallet.
- ◇ Do not keep your wallet in your back pocket.
- ◇ Know where you are going.
- ◇ If it seems too good to be true, it's because it's not true.
