Metro encourages you to follow these parking tips found on www.CoachKruger.com.

Carpool. When heading to an event at the Thomas & Mack, drive with friends. Reducing the number of cars on the road and in the parking lots is the number one solution for easing traffic.

Find an alternate route. The shortest route may not be the best route on game day. Much of the traffic is concentrated near Swenson and Tropicana. If you can, avoid this intersection.

Coming south on I-15? Exit on Spring Mountain and take Paradise to the parking lot.

Coming from Henderson? Come up Maryland Parkway from Russell Road.

Try to approach the Thomas & Mack from the north. If possible, use Paradise from Flamingo/Spring Mtn or Maryland Parkway from Flamingo/Desert Inn

Find your own special parking spot around campus. A short walk may save you a lot of time. A majority of parking around campus is available to fans during games—weekends, holidays, and at night. Try:

The parking garage on the northeast part of the campus at Maryland Parkway and Cottage Grove. Approach from Flamingo. Take a nice walk through campus before and after the game while staying away from the heaviest traffic.

Plenty of parking is available on Maryland Parkway in front of the campus. Also, Maryland Parkway and University Road is a good choice. The walk is shorter than you think.

Parking is available near Swenson and Harmon and the UNLV Athletic Complex. From Paradise, head east on Harmon and cross Swenson. It is a brief walk up Tarkanian Way to the T&M.

Arrive early. If you want to avoid the rush, plan on arriving and parking early for the event. You're better off enjoying the concession stands than sitting in traffic.
